### Course Overview

This qualification is designed to support the Electrical Apprenticeship and provides the apprentice with the skills and knowledge to satisfy the Certificate III in Electrotechnology Electrician qualification.

### Course Content

The course consists of 17 core units of competency, 2 stream core units of competency and 1 elective unit of competency. Some first year units receive direct credit if an NTIS 51908 Certificate I in Electrotechnology Pre Apprenticeship Electrical qualification has been completed. All units of competency must be successfully completed and the apprentice deemed competent in order to attain a certificate. An 'A' Grade Electrical Worker's Licence is granted upon successful completion of the apprenticeship and the 66 capabilities identified by Energy Safety and covered in the Certificate.

### Course Intake

The CET accepts course enrolments throughout the year, with courses commencing **monthly**, subject to student numbers. Please contact our friendly College administration team for specific course commencement dates.

### Course Duration

Generally, this course is completed over three years.

### Course Delivery

Upon course registration employers can select from weekly - Day release or two week block release training delivery. To assist with administration of this course, once selected, the delivery option must be maintained for the calendar year.

### Entry Requirements

The apprenticeship agreement must be signed through a New Apprenticeship Centre (NAC) and registered with the ApprentiCentre. 'On the job' training must be provided by a company with a licensed 'A' grade electrician.

### Skills Recognition

To assist CET in placing you in an appropriate class **we must be informed if you have any prior qualifications or experiences** that may lead to a reduction in your training at the College.

Skills Recognition is a process that can give you credit for modules/ Units of Competency associated with your course. Our Skills Recognition process benefits students who have achieved prior training skills or knowledge and applies to Skills Recognition, Recognition of prior learning (RPL), Credit Transfers and Advance Study or Exemption.

**Should you believe you are entitled to any of the above mentioned, please forward a certified or original copy of your previous records or supporting evidence to the College of Electrical Training prior to commencing your course.**

### Fees / Austudy

The College of Electrical Training attracts the same financial support from Government as any other registered training provider ensuring that there is no cost disadvantage to employers or apprentices.

Fee reductions are available for students who are able to provide approved concession on enrolment.

Learners enrolled in full-time courses are eligible to apply for means-tested Department of Training and Workforce Development, Employment and Workplace Relations Allowances. Applications for allowances are to be made through Centrelink.

### Fee Waiver

Fees may be waived for individual students who are able to demonstrate that payment of fees would produce financial hardship. The College Fee Waiver Policy covering "Financial Hardship" is in accordance with the WA Department of Training and Workforce Development guidelines.

### Cancellation Policy

8 days or more prior to course commencement	100% fee refund
